# Application to amend a clearing permit

The applicant holds clearing permit CPS 10201-1 for the clearing of up to 7.0 ha of land on Lot 550 on Deposited Plan 414367, Talandji for the purpose of development of a decontamination facility and associated access road.

## Amend the size of the area permitted to be cleared

The applicant is requesting that the 7.0 ha approved clearing area is increased by 2.1 ha (approximately 137 m by 150 m) as per the attached shapefile (Attachment 2) and Figure 1 and Figure 2 (Attachment 3). The applicant requires the additional area as they are planning to expand and diversify the existing operations at the site, including providing general scrap services for the local area. Once cleared, the land will initially be used for the temporary stockpiling of iron ore pending export.

Vegetation in the area was mapped in April 2018 (Attachment 4) and consists of scattered areas of mixed shrub cover ranging from 1-2 m over mixed smaller shrubs and hummock grasses, and areas dominated by patches of immature and mature *Triodia* grasses. The vegetation is described as having low species diversity and is extensive throughout the region. The additional 2.1 ha of proposed clearing is not likely to significantly impact biological diversity locally or regionally.

## **Priority flora**

A targeted preclearance survey of the approved clearing area (Attachment 5) was undertaken in August 2023 as per DWER's request prior to the grant of CPS 10201-1. The targeted survey was for three priority flora species specified by DWER: *Abutilon* sp. Onslow (F. Smith s.n. 10/9/61), *Abutilon* sp. *Pritzelianum* (S. van Leeuwen 5095) and *Triumfetta echinata*.

The survey concluded that these species do not occur in the approved clearing area (the area was surveyed comprehensively and no species were recorded). Although the targeted survey did not traverse the whole of the proposed 2.1 ha extension area, the vegetation is contiguous with that in the adjacent approved clearing area and, therefore, it is considered unlikely that the priority flora will be present in the extension area.

## Mitigation

Mitigation methods to reduce impacts of clearing will be implemented as per the current permit, including:

- Appropriate weed management practices;
- Undertake slow progressive directional clearing to allow fauna to move into adjacent habitat ahead of the clearing activity;
- A 10,000 litre water cart will be utilised to stabilise soils; and
- Site preparation and operational activities will commence within three months of the date of clearing.
