CLEARING PERMIT APPLICATION - PROPOSED BEACH ACCESS WAY (BAW) RENEWAL - CENTRAL AND SOUTH SITES, JINDALEE

The City of Wanneroo is proposing to undertake the clearing of remnant vegetation to facilitate the renewal of existing Beach Access Way (BAW) infrastructure within the Jindalee Foreshore Reserve, JINDALEE. The BAW renewal projects have been prioritised by the City as the current structure is not fit for purpose and poses a public safety risk.

To facilitate the project's clearing requirements, it may be necessary to clear an area totalling 0.0836 ha (836m²) of remnant vegetation located within the Jindalee Foreshore Reserve, JINDALEE to allow for the renewal of Central and South beach access ways.

It is proposed that the clearing and construction works associated with the South BAW site will commence in Summer 2023/2024, with project completion occurring in Winter 2024 and the Central BAW site will commence in Summer 2024/2025, with project completion occurring in Winter 2025. Noting the timeframe for these seasonal works, the City would appreciate the Department prioritising the assessment of this application.
