	•	distribution mapping by SLR confirms the project area does not fall within the known range of the Chuditch. Initial identification of Chuditch scat was based on visual assessment and historical distribution mapping; however, definitive identification by genetic testing was not conducted and is no longer possible.			
	Given these findings, Condition 10 is now considered an unnecessary regulatory burden, as it as it lacks a ecological basis and in this context does not provide meaningful environmental protection.
