

CLEARING PERMIT

Granted under section 51E of the Environmental Protection Act 1986

Purpose Permit number: CPS 10740/2

Permit Holder: City of Gosnells

Duration of Permit: From 13/08/2025 to 13/08/2030

The permit holder is authorised to clear *native vegetation* subject to the following conditions of this permit.

PART I – CLEARING AUTHORISED

1. Clearing authorised (purpose)

The permit holder is authorised to clear *native vegetation* for the purpose of reconstruction of a drainage channel and basin and improvement of the surrounding public open space.

2. Land on which clearing is to be done

Lot 105 on Diagram 67847, Maddington Lot 3874 on Plan 19306 (Crown Reserve 41566), Maddington Unnamed road reserve (PIN 12279448), Maddington

3. Clearing authorised

The permit holder must not clear more than 0.48 hectares of *native vegetation* within the area cross-hatched yellow in Figure 1 of Schedule 1.

PART II - MANAGEMENT CONDITIONS

4. Avoid, minimise, and reduce impacts and extent of clearing

In determining the *native vegetation* authorised to be cleared under this permit, the permit holder must apply the following principles, set out in descending order of preference:

- (a) avoid the clearing of *native vegetation*;
- (b) minimise the amount of *native vegetation* to be cleared; and
- (c) reduce the impact of clearing on any environmental value.

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5. Weed and dieback management

When undertaking any clearing authorised under this permit, the permit holder must take the following measures to minimise the risk of introduction and spread of *weeds* and *dieback*:

- (a) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
- (b) ensure that no known *dieback* or *weed*-affected soil, *mulch*, *fill*, or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
- (c) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.

6. Directional clearing

The permit holder must conduct clearing activities in a slow, progressive manner, in a northwest to southwest direction, to allow fauna to move into adjacent *native vegetation* ahead of the clearing activity.

7. Fauna management

- (a) The *fauna specialist* must inspect the area authorised to be cleared under this permit prior to works commencing and for the duration of clearing for any native fauna that may be present.
- (b) Where fauna have been identified under condition 7(a), works must cease until the fauna have escaped into adjacent habitat ahead of the clearing activity or translocated into adjacent native vegetation.

8. Erosion management

- (a) Clearing is not to be undertaken during May to September.
- (b) The permit holder must commence the drainage channel and basin reconstruction and improvement of the surrounding public open space no later than three (3) months after undertaking the authorised clearing activities.

PART III - RECORD KEEPING AND REPORTING

9. Records that must be kept

The permit holder must maintain records relating to the listed relevant matters in accordance with the specifications detailed in Table 1.

10. Reporting

The permit holder must provide to the *CEO* the records required under condition 9 of this permit when requested by the *CEO*.

DEFINITIONS

In this permit, the terms in Table have the meanings defined.

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Clearing Permit Decision Report

Application details and outcome

1.1. Permit application details

Permit number: CPS 10740/2

Permit type: Purpose permit

Applicant name: City of Gosnells

1.2. Description of clearing activities

The vegetation proposed to be cleared is 0.48 hectares contained within a single contiguous 0.5 hectare area in Peace Park, Maddington (see Figure 1, Section 1.5). The application is to selectively clear vegetation within and surrounding a drainage channel and basin to allow the channel and basin to be recontoured and upgraded to improve their operation and drainage capacity. The recontoured channel and surrounding flooded and terrestrial areas will be revegetated. The surrounding public open space will also be improved to include a footpath, boardwalk and rest area.

1.3. Decision on application and key considerations

Decision: Granted

Decision date: 13 August 2025

Decision area: 0.48 hectares (ha) of native vegetation

1.4. Reasons for decision

On 15 January 2025, Clearing Permit CPS 10740/1 was granted to clear 0.48 hectares of native vegetation within Lot 105 on Diagram 67847, Lot 3874 on Plan 19306 (Crown Reserve 41566) and a road reserve (PIN 12279448), Maddington, for the purpose of reconstruction of a drainage channel and basin and improvement of the surrounding public open space.

One appeal was lodged in relation to the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation's (DWER) decision to grant the clearing permit CPS 10740/1.

This clearing permit amendment gives effect to the determination of the Minister for Environment (the Minister) to allow the appeal in part (Appeal Number 003 of 2025). The Minister requires that the following changes are made to conditions of the permit:

 Modify condition 6 of the clearing permit to require that clearing occurs from a northeast to southwest direction.

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 Modify condition 7 of the clearing permit to require that a Fauna Specialist inspects the area authorised to be cleared for the presence of any native fauna, prior to clearing.
- Modify Table 2: Definitions in the clearing permit to include a definition for a Fauna Specialist.

The Delegated Officer has taken the above into consideration and determined to grant an amended clearing permit in accordance to the Minister's determination. The Delegated Officer amended the conditions of the permit to reflect the Minister's recommendations.

The Delegated Officer reviewed the information available at the time of the amendment, noting that the site characteristics and assessment against the clearing principles, as well as planning and other matters have not changed from the clearing permit decision report CPS 10740/1.

Assessment of application

Assessment of impacts on environmental values 2.1.

This amendment is the result of an appeal determination made by the Minister, regarding the conditions of Clearing Permit CPS 10740/1.

The Minister determined that the Department's assessment and decision to grant the permit subject to conditions was justified. Notwithstanding the above, the Minister allowed the appeal to the extent that the proposed fauna management conditions could be strengthened to better address impacts on fauna.

The permit condition 6 currently does not comprise a detailed fauna management condition, particularly in relation to fauna management and the direction of clearing. The Department recommended amending permit condition 6 to require clearing in a manner that directs fauna toward the larger expanse of native vegetation located on the site. To warrant additional safety in relation to habitat values and impacts to fauna, the Department proposed amending the permit condition 7 to require a suitably qualified fauna specialist to inspect the site before clearing.

Having considered the information available, including the Department's recommendation, the Minister is satisfied that it was reasonable for the Department to have granted the permit. Considering that some of the fauna management conditions could be strengthened to better address impacts on fauna, the Minister determined to allow the appeal in part.

The assessment against the clearing principles outlined in Schedule 5 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 (EP Act) is also unchanged and can be found in the Decision Report prepared for Clearing Permit CPS 10740/1.
