#### 5.3 Purpose

Over the past 15 years the City of Stirling has successfully restored every dune in the Trigg Beach area except for the dune opposite the surfing WA building (near the corner of West Coast Dve and West Coast Hwy). Foot traffic from surfers was too excessive for any restoration in this area to be successful, with approximately 40% of the 3,650m2 dune cell was being persistently trampled.

The City of Stirling proposes to install a small surf lookout platform (2x2.5m) which will provide an option for the plethora of surfers wanting to check the surf conditions whilst limiting damage to the dunes and allow natural habitat to be established.

To complement the surf lookout, the City will also undertake a landscape upgrade to the area of public open space adjacent the dunes.

This landscape upgrade will include:

- New beach showers
- Seating and picnic shelter
- Bicycle parking
- · Rationalised and improved turf area
- Low limestone seating walls to provide a clean edge between the turf and sand dunes, and further prevent the public from accessing the dunes
- Garden beds with local coastal planting
- Dune rehabilitation (to complement the rehabilitation completed in this area during winter 2024)

Clearing of dune vegetation will be required to facilitate construction of the limestone retaining walls and surf lookout.

The combined surf lookout and landscape upgrade is illustrated on the attached concept.

Apart from the proposed lookout, the site will remain as natural area/dune vegetation and public open space.

Without being constantly trampled by the public, we anticipate that the dunes can be successfully rehabilitated, with revegetation planned for winter 2025.

Approximately 85sqm of underperforming lawn will be removed as part of the landscape upgrade, and converted to dune vegetation as part of the rehabilitation works.

#### 5.5 Timeframe

Clearing of vegetation will be limited to one week, during mid-2025 (dependent on when clearing permits are received and pending availability of the City's landscape contractor).

Construction of the landscape works as part of this project is expected to take 8-12 weeks, immediately following completion of the clearing.

Note: The clearing referral process is not suitable for any clearing that is expected to take longer than two years.

#### 5.6 Pre-application scoping

Historic clearing of native vegetation in the Swan Coastal Plain and Avon Wheatbelt <u>Interim</u> <u>Biogeographic Regionalisation for Australia</u> (IBRA) bioregions has been extensive.

During construction, the landscape contractors will be required to retain and protect all remaining dune vegetation through temporary site fencing and bunting. Construction activities will be limited to the scope of works area, which will be fenced.  Landscape contractors on the City of Stirling's periodic supply panel, who have a record of successfully completing works to a high standard and in sensitive areas will be selected to undertake the works. The City's technical officers will superintend the construction and regularly inspect the site to ensure any clearing/damage is restricted to the areas of vegetation nominated for removal.

Any suitable, weed free material that is in the area proposed for removal, will be translocated back into the dune section of the Reserve.
