5.3 Purpose

Selective removal and management of <i>Typha</i> spp. will be undertaken to reduce the formation of dense monocultures and promote increased habitat diversity. This will encourage the regeneration and establishment of a broader range of native vegetation communities, supporting a wider variety of native fauna through improved access, foraging opportunities, and overall habitat suitability. The works will also improve hydraulic flow and reduce blockages within the waterway system, enhancing water quality, reducing stagnation, and helping to restore more natural flow regimes. All activities will be carried out in a targeted and environmentally sensitive manner, minimising disturbance to surrounding native vegetation and ensuring the protection of existing ecological values.

5.4 Method

Proposed method of clearing (i.e. burning, cutting, draining, flooding, grazing, mechanical clearing/bulldozing or other – specify)	Clearing methods will be selected based on site conditions and the location of <i>Typha</i> spp. infestations. Control measures will include: • Cutting shoots approximately 15 cm below the water surface to limit regrowth • Cutting shoots above the water surface, followed by targeted application (wiping or spot spraying) of glyphosate All control methods will be applied in a controlled and site-appropriate manner to maximise effectiveness while minimising impacts on surrounding native vegetation and aquatic environments.

Provide the avoidance details (e.g. retention of vegetation on property)	Until recently, <i>Typha orientalis</i> was considered a non-native species. Regardless of its origin, it is highly invasive and capable of forming dense monocultures that outcompete other native vegetation, ultimately reducing biodiversity. Its removal is necessary to provide opportunities for a broader range of native species to naturally regenerate and/or be strategically replanted in targeted areas, thereby enhancing ecosystem diversity and resilience. <i>Typha</i> is also known to encroach upon and choke open water bodies, negatively impacting hydrology, public access, and overall amenity within natural areas. Its proliferation can limit recreational use and diminish the ecological and aesthetic values of these environments. The selective removal of <i>Typha</i> will improve accessibility and encourage greater community appreciation of natural areas, while also supporting the development of a more structurally and biologically diverse ecosystem.
