## AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

Clearing of up to 3.33 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 1175/1.

# **CONDITIONS**

## 1 Revegetation

- (a) The Permit Holder shall retain the vegetative material and topsoil removed by clearing in accordance with this Permit.
- (b) Within six month of the area no longer being required for the purpose of dam construction the permit holder must revegetate the area by:
  - (i) Deliberately planting and/or seeding *native vegetation* that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of *native vegetation* to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area;
  - (ii) Ensuring only local provenance seeds and propagating material from within 10km of the area cleared are used to revegetate the area;
  - (iii) Laying vegetative material and topsoil retained in accordance with condition 1(a) on the area.

#### 2 Fencing

Within one month of the area no longer being required for the purpose of dam construction the permit holder shall construct a *fence* enclosing the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 1175/1. The fence shall be constructed and maintained so as to be adequate to exclude stock access.

#### Weed control

- (a) At least once in each 12 month period for the *term* of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any *weeds* growing within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 1175/1.
- (b) When undertaking any *clearing* or other activity pursuant to this Permit the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of introduction and spread of *weeds*:
  - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared:
  - (ii) avoid the movement of soil in wet conditions;
  - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.

## 4 Definitions

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

clearing has the meaning given to it in section 51A of the Environmental Protection Act 1986;

fence means a structure, that is permanently fixed to the ground, for controlling movement of persons or animals;

native vegetation has the meaning given to it in sections 3 and 51A of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 and regulation 4 of the Environmental Protection (Clearing of Native Vegetation) Regulations 2004;

revegetation means the re-establishment of a cover of native vegetation in an area such that the species composition, structure and density is similar to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area, and can involve regeneration, direct seeding and/or planting;

term means the duration of this Permit, including as amended or renewed; and

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
