AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 32 native trees within the area cross hatched yellow on attached Plan 1286/1.

CONDITIONS

1. (a) The Permit Holder must revegetate the area cross hatched red on Plan 1286/1 by deliberately planting or seeding native vegetation that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of native vegetation is similar to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area.
(b) The revegetation species shall consist of local endemic species found within 10km of the proposed clearing.
(c) The revegetation is to be completed 12 months after the completion of extractive works.
2. The Permit Holder shall ensure that livestock shall be excluded from the area cross hatched red by means of a stock proof fence and shall not cause or permit stock to enter or remain within the area.
3. At least once in each 12 month period for the term of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any weeds growing within areas cleared and revegetated under this Permit.
4. The Permit Holder shall retain *mature trees* with hollows found in situ within the area crossed hatched yellow on attached Plan 1286/1 and place within the area cross hatched red on attached Plan 1286/1, while implementing the revegetation outlined in Condition 1 of this permit.
5. In this permit *mature tree* means a native tree with a trunk greater than 30cm in diameter.
