PERMIT HOLDER

Commissioner of Main Roads WA

LAND ON WHICH CLEARING IS TO BE DONE

Road Reserve, Great Northern Highway, corner of Roe Highway

AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 0.6 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross hatched yellow on attached Plan 1428/1.

CONDITIONS

- 1) The permit holder must remove or kill *weeds* growing within the areas cross-hatched red on Plan 1428/1
 - a) Prior to the commencement of revegetation activities described in condition 2; and
 - b) At least every twelve months for the duration of this permit.
- 2) The Permit Holder shall revegetate the area cross hatched red on attached Plan 1428/1 by 1 December 2008 by:
 - a) Deliberately planting and/or seeding *native vegetation* that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of *native vegetation* to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area; and
 - b) Ensuring only local provenance seeds and propagating material from within a 20 km radius of the area cleared are used to revegetate the area;
- 3) The Permit Holder must maintain the following records pursuant to this Permit:
 - a) Date of weed control activities
 - b) Description of weed control
 - c) The commencement date of revegetation;
 - d) A description of the revegetation activities undertaken; and
 - e) The species, structure and composition of revegetation measured.

4) The Permit Holder must provide to the *CEO* on or before 30 June of each year, for the *term* of this permit, a written report of records requested under condition 3 and activities done by the Permit Holder under this Permit between 1 January and 31 December of the preceding year.

DEFINITIONS

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Environment and Conservation;

native vegetation has the meaning given to it in sections 3 and 51A of the Environmental Protection Act 1986 and regulation 4 of the Environmental Protection (Clearing of Native Vegetation) Regulations 2004;

revegetation means the re-establishment of a cover of *native vegetation* in an area such that the species composition, structure and density is similar to pre-*clearing* vegetation types in that area, and can involve regeneration, direct seeding and/or planting;

term means the duration of this Permit, including as amended or renewed;

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
