## PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE CLEARING MAY BE DONE

Clearing for the purpose of constructing accommodation buildings and infrastructure

## CONDITIONS

- 1. The Permit Holder shall not clear more than 2.8 hectares of native vegetation from within the area hatched yellow on attached Plan 1619/1
- Avoid, Minimise Etc Clearing

In determining the amount of native vegetation to be cleared for the purposes of road grades and widening the Permit Holder must have regard to the following principles, set out in order of preference:

- i. avoid the clearing of native vegetation;
- ii. minimise the amount of native vegetation to be cleared; and
- iii. reduce the impact of clearing on any environmental value.
- 3 Weed control

When undertaking any clearing to this Permit the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of weeds:

- clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared:
- ii) ensure that no weed-affected road building materials, mulch, fill or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
- iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
