### PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE CLEARING MAY BE DONE

1. Clearing for the purposes of road construction.

### **CONDITIONS**

- 1. This permit authorises the clearing up to 1.3 ha of native vegetation within the area cross hatched yellow on attached Plan 1679/1.
- 2. When undertaking any clearing the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of weeds:
  - (i)clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared; (ii)ensure that no weed-affected *road building materials*, *mulch*, *fill* or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
  - (iii)restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
- 3. At least once in each 12 month period for the *term* of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any *weeds* growing within area shaded red on attached Plan 1679/1.

### **Definitions**

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

clearing has the meaning given to it in section 51A of the Environmental Protection Act 1986;

fill means material used to increase the ground level, or fill a hollow;

mulch means the use of organic matter, wood chips or rocks to slow the movement of water across the soil surface and to reduce evaporation;

road building materials means rock, gravel, soil, stone, timber, boulders and water;

term means the duration of this Permit, including as amended or renewed;

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
