### AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of 0.35 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 1734/1 for the purpose of rehabilitation and construction of stormwater bioremediation ponds.

### CONDITIONS

### 1 Dieback and Weed Control

- a) When undertaking any clearing, *revegetation* and *rehabilitation*, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of introduction and spread of *dieback*:
  - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared:
  - (ii) avoid the movement of soil in wet conditions;
  - (iii) ensure that no dieback-affected materials are brought into an area that is not affected by dieback; and
  - (iv) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
- b) When undertaking any clearing, *revegetation* and *rehabilitation*, or other activity pursuant to this Permit the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *weeds*:
  - clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared:
  - (ii) ensure that no weed-affected material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
  - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
- c) At least once in each 12 month period for the *term* of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any *weeds* growing within areas cleared, *revegetated* and *rehabilitated* under this Permit.

# 2 Revegetation

- a) Within one month of the construction of bio remediation ponds, the permit holder must revegetate the area no longer required for the purpose of stormwater bioremediation pond construction by:
  - (i) Deliberately planting and/or seeding native vegetation that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of native vegetation to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area;
  - (ii) Ensuring only local provenance seeds and propagating material from within 10km of the area cleared are used to revegetate the area.

- b) Within one year of undertaking revegetation in accordance with condition 2(a), the Permit Holder must
  - (i) Determine the species composition, structure and density of the area revegetated in accordance with condition 2(a)(i); and
  - (ii) Where, in the opinion of an *environmental specialist*, the composition structure and density determined under condition 2(b)(i) will not result in a similar species composition, structure and density to preclearing vegetation types in that area the Permit Holder must undertake additional planting or seeding of native vegetation in accordance with the requirements of condition 2(a)(i) and (ii).

# 3 Records to be Kept

The Permit Holder must maintain the following records for activities done pursuant to this Permit, as relevant:

In relation to the revegetation and rehabilitation of areas pursuant to condition 2:

- (i) The location of any area revegetated and rehabilitated recorded using Geocentric Datum Australia 1994;
- (ii) A description of the revegetation and rehabilitation activities undertaken; and
- (iii) The size of the area revegetated and rehabilitated (in hectares).

# 4 Reporting

The Permit Holder must provide to the CEO, a written report of records required under condition 3.

#### 5 Definitions

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

dieback means the effect of Phytophthora species on native vegetation;

Environmental Specialist means a person who is engaged by the permit holder for the purpose of providing environmental advice, who holds a tertiary qualification in environmental science or equivalent, and has experience relevant to the type of environmental advice that an environmental specialist is required to provide under this Permit;

**rehabilitation** means actively managing an area containing native vegetation in order to improve the ecological function of that area;

revegetation means the re-establishment of a cover of native vegetation in an area such that the species composition, structure and density is similar to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area, and can involve regeneration, direct seeding and/or planting;

term means the duration of this Permit, including as amended or renewed;

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
