### PURPOSE FOR WHICH THE CLEARING MAY BE DONE

1. Clearing for the purposes of mineral production.

### CONDITIONS

1. The Permit Holder must not clear more than 60 hectares of native vegetation. All clearing must be within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 2171/1.
2. The Permit Holder shall record the following for each instance of clearing:
  - a) the location of where the clearing occurred, expressed as grid coordinates using the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 coordinate system;
  - b) the size of the area cleared in hectares;
  - c) the dates on which the area was cleared;
  - d) the method of clearing; and
  - e) the purpose of clearing.
3. The Permit Holder shall ensure that all vehicles, tools, footwear and machinery are cleaned of all soil and plant material when entering or exiting the area marked cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 2171/1.
4. The Permit Holder shall implement weed control measures to prevent the establishment of weeds within the Clearing Permit Area, as marked cross-hatched yellow on the attached Plan 2171/1.
5. The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the Director, Environment Division, of the Department of Industry and Resources by 31 January 2009 and each subsequent year for the life of this permit, demonstrating adherence to all the conditions of this permit, and setting out the records required under Conditions 2 of this permit in relation to the clearing activities carried out between 1 January and 31 December the previous year.
