	Due to changes in mining activities and priorities, the area of expected clearing has not been progressed. Nickel West requests an extension to Condition 4, to extend by a further 5 years to until 31 October 2025 to enable the approved clearing.								
	Should the permit duration require extension to allow for 10 years of rehabilitation (Condition 9), we would accept an extension to the overall permit duration to 31 October 2035.
