## **AUTHORISED ACTIVITY**

Clearing of up to 14.1 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 2533/1.

# CONDITIONS

1 The Permit Holder must not clear more than 14.1 hectares of native vegetation, within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 2533/1.

# 2 Dieback and weed control

- (a) When undertaking any clearing, or other activity pursuant to this Permit, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *dieback*:
  - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
  - (ii) avoid the movement of soil in wet conditions;
  - (iii) ensure that no dieback-affected material is brought into an area that is not affected by dieback; and
  - (iv) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
- (b) When undertaking any clearing, or other activity pursuant to this Permit, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *weeds*:
  - clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared:
  - (ii) ensure that no weed-affected material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
  - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.

# **DEFINITIONS**

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

dieback means the effect of Phytophthora species on native vegetation;

weed/s means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
