AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 66.17 hectares of native vegetation within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 2847/1.

CONDITIONS

Weed Control

1. When undertaking any clearing or other activity authorised under this Permit, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of weeds:
 - (i) Clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
 - (ii) Ensure that no *weed*-affected soil, *mulch*, *fill* or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
 - (iii) Restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.

Rehabilitation

2. The Permit Holder shall stockpile all topsoil and vegetation cleared under this Permit for use in rehabilitation.

Record Keeping

3. The Permit Holder shall record the following for each instance of clearing:
 - (i) the location of where the clearing occurred, expressed as grid coordinates using the Geocentric Datum of Australia 1994 coordinate system;
 - (ii) the size of the area cleared in hectares;
 - (iii) the dates on which the area was cleared;
 - (iv) the purpose of clearing; and
 - (v) the method of clearing.

Reporting

4. The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the Director, Environment Division, Department of Mines and Petroleum by 1 June 2009, demonstrating adherence to all conditions of this permit, and setting out the records required under condition 3 of this permit in relation to clearing carried out between 7 February 2009 and 1 June 2009.

Definitions

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

fill means material used to increase the ground level, or fill a hollow;

mulch means the use of organic matter, woodchips or rocks to slow the movement of water across the soil surface and to reduce evaporation;

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the *Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976*.
