Application for a clearing permit (purpose permit)

Environmental Protection Act 1986 s 51E

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

Part 1 Land details

The location of the land where clearing is proposed must be accurately described.

Proposed method of clearing
Backhoe, bobcat and a front end loader where necessary in the skate park site. Chainsaw along the proposed fenceline.

Period within which clearing is proposed to be undertaken, e.g. May 2010 – June 2010

Purpose of clearing
a) To clear land for the construction of a permanent, fixed concrete skate park structure and surrounding landscaping (including a seating area and small shelter). Photographs of the skate park site are provided in Attachment Two.
b) To erect a fence along the railway line with minimum vegetation disturbance possible. A map of the fenceline is provided in Attachment One.

Part 3 Applicant

To apply for a permit you must either be:

- the landowner; or
- have the authority of the landowner to access the land and undertake the clearing.

If granted, the permit will be issued in the name of the applicant.
