Application for a clearing permit (area permit)

Environmental Protection Act 1986 s 51E

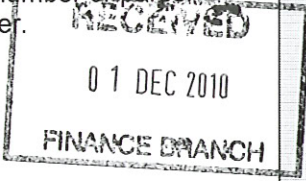
Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

Part 1 Land details

The land where clearing is proposed must be accurately described.

Purpose of clearing

Clearing a small area of the reserve is necessary for the construction of a new bore to supply water to the townsite.

The area under application consists of common shrubland consisting of *Myrtaceae*, *Acacia*, *Melaleuca* and *Allocasuarina* species. Several emergent Sheoak and Jam trees less than ten years of age are present, however, the area under application is flexible and can be moved slightly to avoid the trees if necessary. Native grasses dominate the more degraded section of the area. Please see photos attached.

Part 3 Applicant

To apply for a permit you must either be:

- The owner of the land;
 - Acting on the owner's behalf; or
 - Likely to become the owner of the land.
- Note: If you are not the landowner, you must attach a letter of authority explicitly stating that you, the applicant, has authority to clear on the said land.
