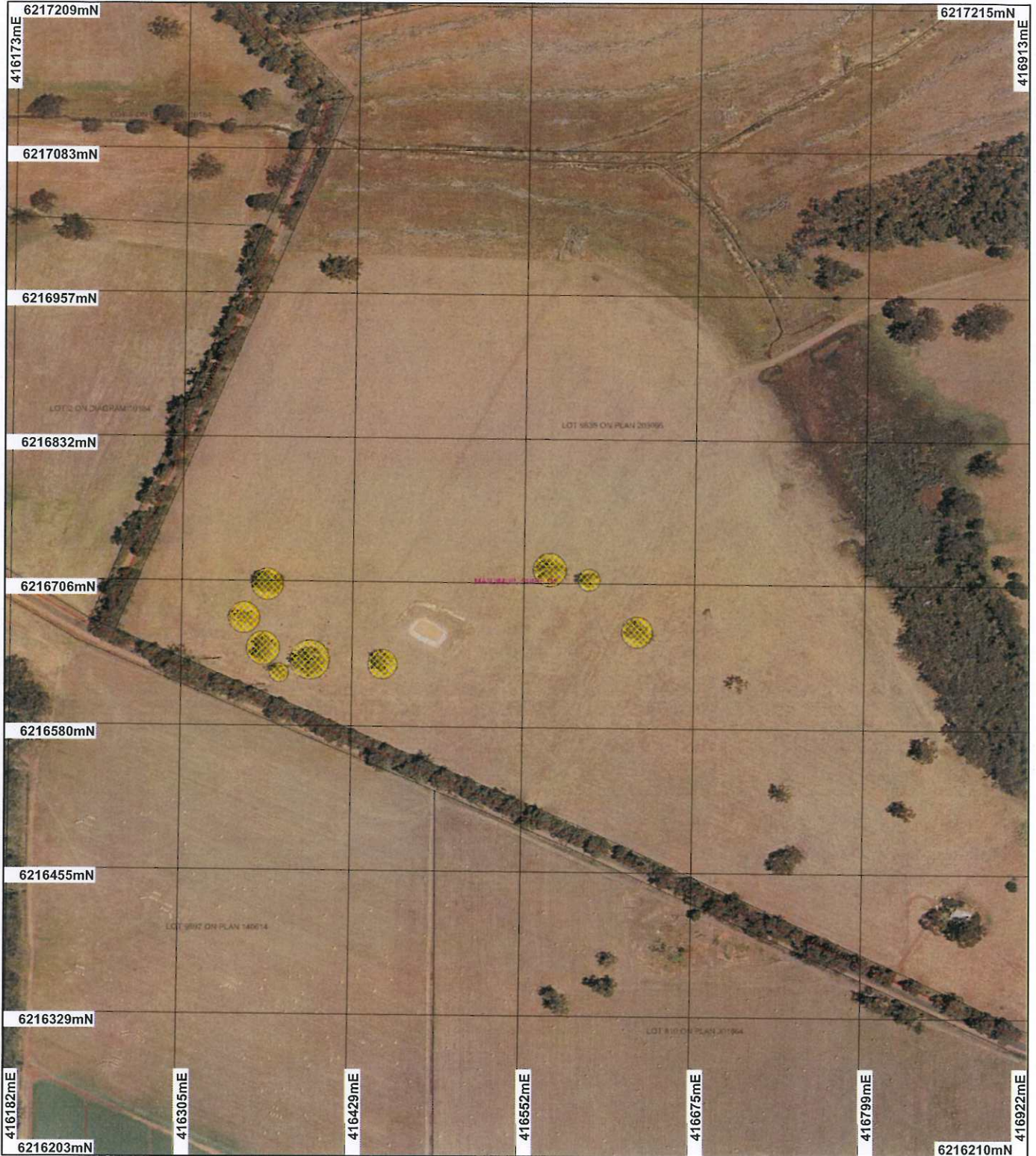



2.1. Existing environment and information

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Beard Vegetation Association 3: Medium forest; jarrah-marri (Shepherd, 2009).	The application is to clear 9 native trees to install a pivot irrigator. The vegetation is considered to be in a completely degraded (Keighery, 1994) condition with limited understorey.	Completely Degraded: No longer intact; completely/almost completely without native species (Keighery 1994)	The condition of the vegetation was assessed through aerial imagery.

3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

Comments

The application to clear 9 native trees to install a pivot irrigator is unlikely to have any significant environmental impacts. The vegetation is considered to be in a completely degraded (Keighery, 1994) condition with no understorey present.

There are no declared rare flora species or threatened ecological communities in the vicinity of the application. The vegetation to be cleared is well represented in the local area, and would not have a detrimental impact on fauna.

The proposed clearing is unlikely to cause land degradation, water quality issues or increase to intensity and duration of flooding.

The assessment of the application found that the clearing is not likely to be at variance to any of the principles.
