#### ROAD RESERVES WITHIN SHIRE OF MENZIES:

Snake Hill - Riverina Road	0.00 SLK to 27.00 SLK
Leonora - Mount Ida Road	0.00 SLK to 38.5 SLK
Yarri Road	0.00 SLK to 37.00 SLK
Kookynie - Yarri Road Part 1	33.00 SLK to 39.00 SLK
Kookynie - Yarri Road Part 2	48.00 SLK to 94.00 SLK

### AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 177 hectares for the purposes of road construction or maintenance.

### CONDITIONS

1. The Permit Holder shall record the following for each instance of clearing:
  - (a) location where clearing occurred;
  - (b) purpose; and
  - (c) area cleared in hectares.
2. The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the CEO by 31 January each year setting out the records required under condition 1 of this permit in relation to clearing carried out between 1 January and 31 December of the previous year.
3. The Permit Holder shall identify native vegetation associated with any salt lake within the area shaded in red on Plan 463/2a, and delineate these areas in a visible manner.
4. The Permit Holder shall not clear within areas delineated under condition 3.
5. This permit does not authorise the clearing of native vegetation on the Kookynie-Yarri Road unless the permit holder :
  - (a) conducts a survey for *Eremophila eversa* along the road reserve in accordance with Guidance Statement No. 51 Terrestrial Flora and Vegetation Surveys for Environmental Impact Assessment in Western Australia, June 2004, Environmental Protection Authority or to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive Officer; and
  - (b) if *Eremophila eversa* is found, the permit holder must prepare and implement a management plan to reduce the impact of clearing on *Eremophila eversa* in consultation with CALM and to the satisfaction of the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Environment.

**DEFINITIONS**

1. Except as otherwise provided, terms used in this Permit have the meaning set out in the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*.
2. SLK means Straight Line Kilometre, measured at 5 kilometres intervals from the start of all highways and main roads within Western Australia. Database maintained by Main Roads Western Australia.
3. 'salt lake' means areas shown on Plan 463/2a,b,c,d in blue.
