Purpose of clearing

Clear regrowth on land that has been used as pasture and cultivation within the last ten years.
The clearing is only to the extent necessary to enable the land to be used to the maximum extent to which it was used in those 10 years.

- have the authority of the landowner to access the land and undertake the clearing.

If granted, the permit will be issued in the name of the applicant.
