AUTHORISED ACTIVITY

1. Clearing of up to 2.5 hectares of *native vegetation* within the area cross-hatched yellow on attached Plan 562/1.

CONDITIONS

1. The Permit Holder shall not clear any *native vegetation* within the area hatched red on attached Plan 562/1.
2. The Permit Holder shall ensure that *ground cover* is established within the area hatched yellow on attached Plan 562/1.
3. When undertaking *clearing*, or other activity pursuant to this Permit the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *weeds*:
 - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
 - (ii) ensure that no *mulch, fill* or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
 - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.

DEFINITION

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

clearing has the meaning given to it in section 51A of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*;


fill means material used to increase the ground level, or fill a hollow;

ground cover means a low spreading plant which covers the earth and retards the growth of weeds;

mulch means the use of organic matter, wood chips or rocks to slow the movement of water across the soil surface and to reduce evaporation;

native vegetation has the meaning given to it in sections 3 and 51A of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* and regulation 4 of the *Environmental Protection (Clearing of Native Vegetation) Regulations 2004*;

weed means a species listed in Appendix 3 of the "Environmental Weed Strategy" published by the Department of Conservation and Land Management (1999), and plants declared under section 37 of the Agricultural and Related Resources Protection Act 1976.
