Purpose of clearing

Due to massive water runoff from neighboring paddocks the quality of the road degrades rapidly after rain. This degradation can and has become a hazard for road users as the road can become very uneven, sandy and the erosion causes massive holes. Creating new and maintaining existing road side drains is imperative to guide water off the road and into surrounding bushland to minimise damage to the road. No maintenance has been carried out on this road for many years and as such there is a significant amount of vegetation growing in the side drains, encroaching onto the road. This vegetation is impeding on local farmers' ability to drive their farm machinery on the road due to it's narrow width. This problem has been made known to the Shire on a number of occasions.
