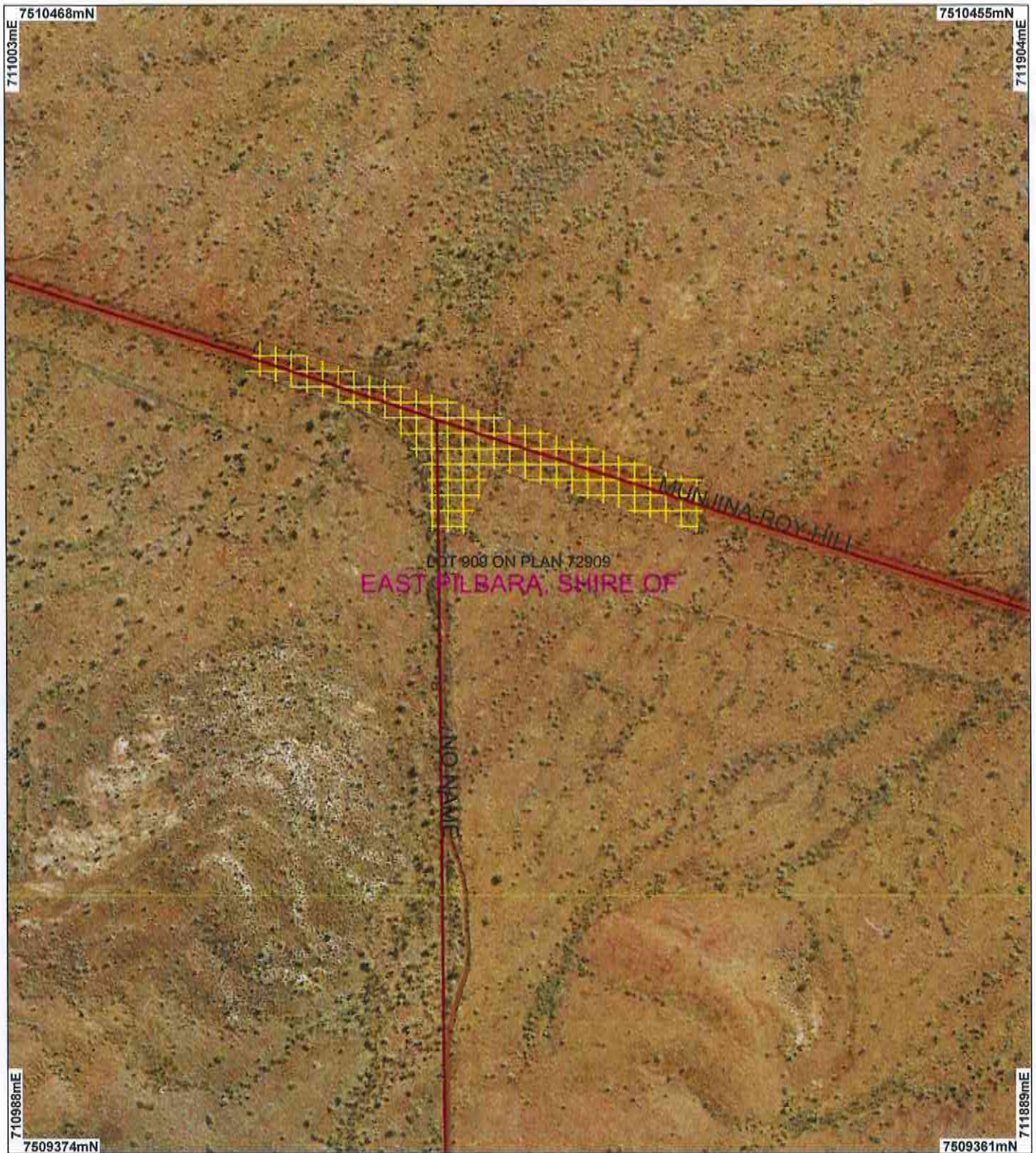

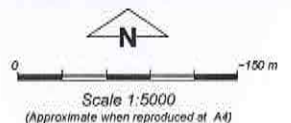


# Plan 5911/1

## 2. Site Information

### 2.1. Existing environment and information

#### 2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description	Vegetation Condition
Mapped Beard Vegetation Association 111 is described as hummock grasslands, shrub steppe; Eucalyptus gamophylla over hard spinifex (Shepherd et al 2001).	Good: Structure significantly altered by multiple disturbance; retains basic structure/ability to regenerate (Keighery 1994)

## 3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

**Comments** The application is to clear one hectare of native vegetation within Lot 909 on Plan 72909 (Munjina-Roy Hill Road), Newman, for the purpose of upgrading a road intersection.

Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, wetlands, watercourses, land degradation, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the clearing under application may be at variance with principle (f) and is not likely to be at variance to the remaining principles.

There are numerous minor non-perennial watercourses that cross Munjina-Roy Hill Road. One of these watercourses crosses the area of road that is being upgraded.

No submissions have been received on this application to clear.

The Banjima People native title claimants and the Yamatji Marlpa Aboriginal Corporation have been notified of the proposed clearing.
