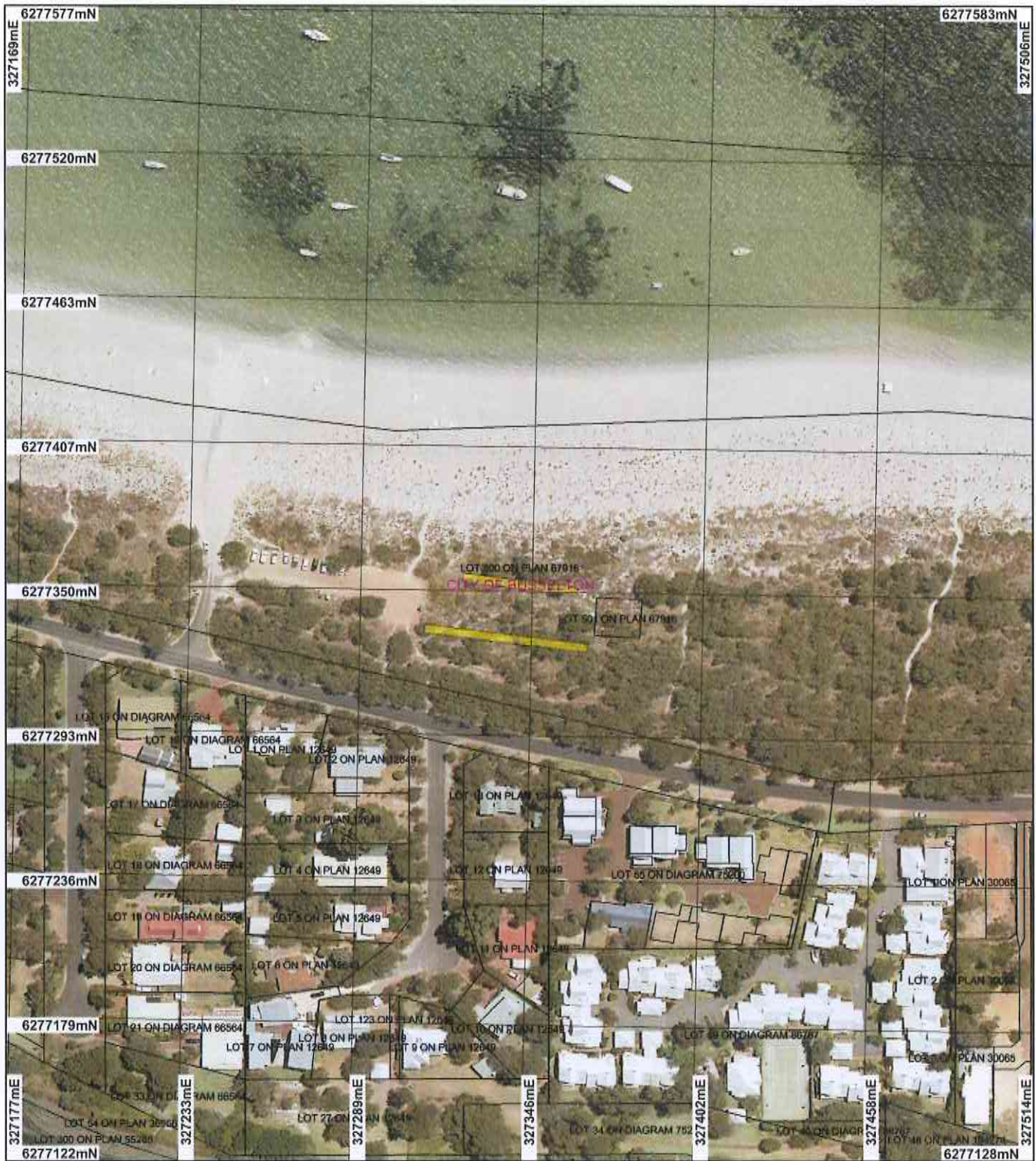

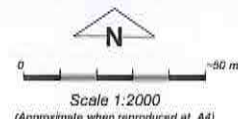

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description

The vegetation under application has been mapped as Beard Vegetation Association 990: Low forest: peppermint (*Agonis flexuosa*) (Shepherd et al, 2001).

Vegetation Condition

Good: Structure significantly altered by multiple disturbance; retains basic structure/ability to regenerate (Keighery 1994)

3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

Comments

The application is for the proposed clearing of 0.03 hectares of native vegetation within Lot 500 on Deposited Plan 67916, Quindalup, for the purpose of extending the Dunn Bay Yacht Club carpark.

Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, wetlands, watercourses, land degradation, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the clearing under application is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.
