3. Area of Clearing

The Permit Holder must not clear more than two hectares of native vegetation within the area hatched yellow on attached Plan 6093/1.

This Permit allows the Permit Holder to authorise persons, including employees, contractors and agents of the Permit Holder, to clear native vegetation for the purposes of this Permit subject to compliance with the conditions of this Permit and approval from the Permit Holder.

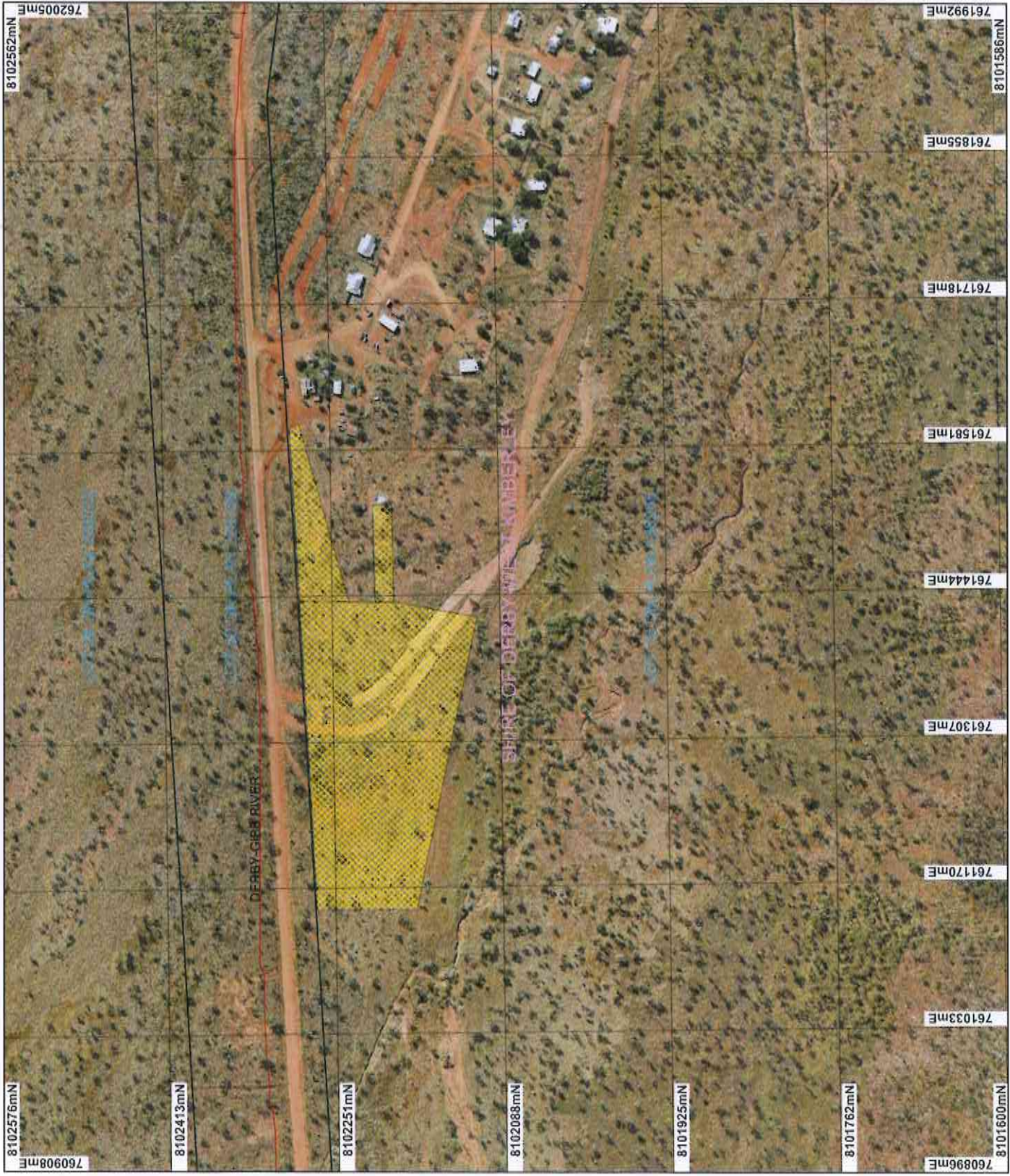

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description

Mapped Beard vegetation association:
739: Grasslands, high grass savanna woodland; grey box (*Eucalyptus tectriflora*) & cabbage gum over white grass (*Sehima nervosum*) (Shepherd et al, 2001).

Vegetation Condition

Completely Degraded: No longer intact; completely/almost completely without native species (Keighery 1994)
to
Very Good: Vegetation structure altered; obvious signs of disturbance (Keighery 1994)

3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

Comments

The application is for the proposed clearing of two hectares of native vegetation within Lot 16 on Plan 188265, King Leopold Ranges, for the purpose of constructing a commercial camping ground.

Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, wetlands, watercourses, land degradation, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the clearing under application is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.
