

CLEARING PERMIT

Granted under section 51E of the Environmental Protection Act 1986

The Permit Holder is authorised to clear native vegetation subject to the following conditions of this Permit.

PART I - CLEARING AUTHORISED

1. Land on which clearing is to be done

2. Purpose for which clearing may be done

Clearing for the purpose of pipeline construction and associated activities.

3. Area of Clearing

The Permit Holder must not clear more than 1,000 hectares of native vegetation.

4. Staged Clearing

The Permit Holder shall not clear native vegetation unless the purpose for which the clearing was authorised is enacted within 6 months of the authorised clearing being undertaken.

5. Application

This Permit allows the Permit Holder to authorise persons, including employees, contractors and agents of the Permit Holder, to clear native vegetation for the purposes of this Permit subject to compliance with the conditions of this Permit and approval from the Permit Holder.

PART II - MANAGEMENT CONDITIONS

6. Weed control

- (a) When undertaking any clearing or other activity authorised under this Permit, the Permit Holder must take the following steps to minimise the risk of the introduction and spread of *weeds*:
 - (i) clean earth-moving machinery of soil and vegetation prior to entering and leaving the area to be cleared;
 - (ii) ensure that no *weed*-affected soil, *mulch*, *fill* or other material is brought into the area to be cleared; and
 - (iii) restrict the movement of machines and other vehicles to the limits of the areas to be cleared.
- (b) At least once in each 12 month period for the term of this Permit, the Permit Holder must remove or kill any *weeds* growing within the areas cleared under this permit.

7. Monitoring Plan

- (a) By 1 September 2015 the Permit Holder must submit a Monitoring Plan for the Sandhill Dunnart (*Sminthopsis psammophila*) to the CEO.
- (b) The Monitoring Plan must include:
 - (i) The method of monitoring;
 - (ii) The location of the monitoring; and
 - (iii) The frequency and timing of monitoring.
- (c) The Monitoring Plan must be approved by the CEO prior to being implemented.
- (d) The approved Monitoring Plan must be implemented by the Permit Holder.
- (e) If it is necessary to modify the Monitoring Plan, the Permit Holder must submit the modified plan to the CEO.
- (f) A modified Monitoring Plan must not be implemented until approved by the CEO.

8. Flora Management

Where *Caesia talingka*, *Labichea eremaea* and *Melaleuca apostiba* have been identified and their written locations provided to the CEO within report "Sunrise Dam Gold Mine to Tropicana Gold Mine Gas Pipeline Level 1 Flora and Vegetation Survey, July 2014", the Permit Holder shall ensure that:

- (i) no clearing occurs within 10 metres of *Caesia talingka*, *Labichea eremaea* and *Melaleuca apostiba*, unless first approved by the *CEO*.
- (ii) no clearing of *Caesia talingka*, *Labichea eremaea* and *Melaleuca apostiba* occurs, unless first approved by the *CEO*.

9. Fauna Management

The Permit Holder shall not clear within 50 metres of Malleefowl (*Leipoa ocellata*) mounds at the following locations:

- (i) 645881 mE 6763450 mN Zone 51
- (ii) 466511 mE 6781782 mN Zone 51

PART III - RECORD KEEPING AND REPORTING

10. Records to be kept

The Permit Holder must maintain the following records for activities done pursuant to this Permit:

In relation to the clearing of native vegetation authorised under this Permit,

- (i) the location where the clearing occurred, recorded using a Global Positioning System (GPS) unit set to Geocentric Datum Australia 1994 (GDA94), expressing the geographical coordinates in Eastings and Northings or decimal degrees;
- (ii) the date that the area was cleared:
- (iii) the size of the area cleared (in hectares); and
- (iv) purpose for which clearing was undertaken.

11. Reporting

- (a) The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the Director Operations, Environment, Department of Mines and Petroleum by 1 October each year for the life of this permit, demonstrating adherence to all conditions of this permit, and setting out the records required under Condition 10 of this permit in relation to clearing carried out between 1 July and 30 June of the previous financial year.
- (b) Prior to 21 February 2020, the Permit Holder must provide to the Director Operations, Environment, Department of Mines and Petroleum a written report of records required under Condition 10 of this Permit where these records have not already been provided under Condition 11(a) of this Permit.

DEFINITIONS

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Permit:

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of Environment Regulation or an officer with delegated authority under Section 20 of the Environmental Protection Act 1986;

fill means material used to increase the ground level, or fill a hollow;

mulch means the use of organic matter, wood chips or rocks to slow the movement of water across the soil surface and to reduce evaporation;

weed/s means any plant -

- (a) that is declared under the section 22 of the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007; or
- (b) published in a Department of Parks and Wildlife Regional Weed Summary, regardless of ranking; or
- (c) not indigenous to the area concerned.
