Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

Proposed method of clearing

By hand dead shrubs and logs will be removed. small shrubs, bushes and grasses located in test plots will be removed as well. No trees or large shrubs will be removed.

Period within which clearing is proposed to be undertaken, e.g. May 2010-June 2010

October 2014- November 2014

Purpose of clearing

To clear areas along the proposed fence line and areas located within the test plots. This is to allow us to carry out a trial for a novel treatment method to control Phytophthora on native species. We require removal of some plants present on the site to erect a fence to prevent intruder access as well as allow for soil remediation and replanting of susceptible native plant species.

Part 3 Applicant

To apply for a permit you must either be:

- the landowner; or
- have the authority of the landowner to access the land and undertake the clearing.

If granted, the permit will be issued in the name of the applicant.
