

**Application for a clearing permit (purpose permit)**

Environmental Protection Act 1986 s 51E

FORM C2

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

The location of the land where clearing is proposed must be accurately described.

Land description: volume and folio number, lot or location number(s), Crown lease or reserve number, pastoral lease number or mining tenement number of all properties.

The land to be cleared located within the Main Roads easement along the Eyre Highway. The proposed clearing is approximately 700 km southeast of Perth, 120 km east of Norseman as shown in Figure 1 of the supporting document.
