2.1. Existing environment and information

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description

The vegetation under application has been mapped as Beard Vegetation Association 500 which is described as Mosaic: Medium woodland: merrit & red mallee / Shrublands; dodonaea scrub (Shepherd et al, 2001)

Vegetation Condition

Degraded: Structure severely disturbed; regeneration to good condition requires intensive management (Keighery 1994).

3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

Comments

The application is for 0.2 hectares of native vegetation within Lot 14 on Deposited Plan 219694, Fraser Range for the purpose of constructing a slip lane.

Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, wetlands, watercourses, land degradation, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the clearing under application is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.
