CONDITIONS

1. This permit authorises the clearing of up to 16.4 hectares of native vegetation within the area solid filled yellow on attached Plan 671/1 for the purposes of road construction and sand extraction.
2. The Permit Holder must revegetate all areas cleared for the purpose of sand extraction in accordance with the following:
 - (a) The Permit Holder shall retain the vegetative material and topsoil removed by clearing in accordance with this Permit.
 - (b) Within two months of the area no longer being required for the purpose of sand extraction the permit holder must revegetate the area by:
 - (i) Deep ripping the soil to a depth to 1 m;
 - (ii) Laying vegetative material and topsoil retained in accordance with condition 2(a) on the area;
 - (c) Within one year of undertaking revegetation in accordance with condition 2(b), the Permit Holder must:
 - (i) Determine the species composition, structure and density of the area revegetated in accordance with condition 2(b);
 - (ii) Where, in the opinion of a *flora specialist*, the composition, structure and density determined under condition 2(c)(i) will not result in that similar to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area, the Permit Holder must plant and/or seed native vegetation that will result in a similar species composition, structure and density of native vegetation to pre-clearing vegetation types in that area, ensuring that only local provenance seeds and propagating material from within 10km of the area cleared are used to revegetate the area.
3. The Permit Holder shall record the following for each instance of clearing: the location where clearing occurred, the co-ordinates of the areas cleared using Geocentric Datum Australia 1994, and area cleared in hectares and any deliberate planting or seeding of native vegetation as referred to in condition 2.
4. The Permit Holder shall provide a report to the CEO by 31 March setting out the records required under condition 3 of this permit in relation to clearing carried out between 1 January and 31 December of the previous year.

DEFINITIONS

flora specialist means a person with specific training and/or experience in the ecology and taxonomy of Western Australian flora.
