Purpose of clearing

The Pilbara Ports Authority (PPA), in preparation for taking responsibility for management of Port Walcott, is responsible for the management of the marine traffic within the waters surrounding Port Walcott. Currently PPA has limited visability of the water surrounding Port Walcott and therefore plans to install a new Vessel Traffic Services (TVS) tower to provide better surveillance of shipping in and around Port Walcott. This construction of the VTS tower will necessitate the clearing of native vegetation on a small area of land that surrounds an existing WaterCorp water tank.
