The Permit Holder is authorised to clear native vegetation subject to the following conditions of this Permit.

1. Purpose for which clearing may be done

Clearing for the purpose of increasing pedestrian safety.

2. Land on which clearing is to be done

Lot 4847 on Plan 6229, Eaton.

3. Area of Clearing

The Permit Holder must not clear more than 0.002 hectares of native vegetation within the area hatched yellow on attached Plan 6870/1.

4. Application

This Permit allows the Permit Holder to authorise persons, including employees, contractors and agents of the Permit Holder, to clear native vegetation for the purposes of this Permit subject to compliance with the conditions of this Permit and approval from the Permit Holder.

5. Type of clearing authorised

This Permit authorises the Permit Holder to clear native vegetation for the activities described in condition 1 of this Permit to the extent that the Permit Holder has the power to carry out works involving clearing for those activities under the *Local Government Act 1995* or any other written law.

Reasons for Decision: The clearing application has been assessed against the clearing principles, planning instruments and other matters in accordance with s51O of the Environmental Protection Act 1986, and has concluded that the proposed clearing is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.

Through assessment it has been determined that the clearing is unlikely to have any significant environmental impacts. State policies and other relevant policies have been taken into consideration in the decision to grant a clearing permit.

2. Site Information

2.1. Existing environment and information

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description	Vegetation Condition
The vegetation under application has been mapped as Beard vegetation association 6 which is described as medium woodland, tuart and jarrah (Shepherd et. al., 2001).	Completely Degraded; No longer intact, completely/almost completely without native species (Keighery, 1994).

3. Assessment of application against clearing principles

Comments The application is to clear 2 dead native trees within a 0.002 hectare area for the purpose of improving path safety. The understorey below the trees is dominated by introduced grasses (Shire of Dardanup, 2015).

Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, wetlands, watercourses, land degradation, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the proposed clearing is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.

No submissions have been received in relation to this application. One Aboriginal Site of Significance has been mapped over the application area. The applicant is advised to contact the Department of Aboriginal affairs in relation to their obligations under the Aboriginal Heritage Act, 1972.
