# VEGETATION CONSERVATION NOTICE

CPS 6897/1

# Person to whom this vegetation conservation notice is given:

(being the owner and occupier of the land described below)

The Shire of Coorow

## Land to which this vegetation conservation notice relates ("the land"):

Lot 709 on Deposited Plan 219608 as comprised on Certificate of Title Volume LR3109 Folio 756 And

Lot 710 on Deposited Plan 219608 as comprised on Certificate of Title Volume LR3109 Folio 757 And

Lot 712 on Deposited Plan 219608 as comprised on Certificate of Title Volume LR3109 Folio 759

## Reasons for which this vegetation conservation notice is given:

This vegetation conservation notice is given because I reasonably suspect on the following grounds that unlawful clearing, as defined by Section 70(1) of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986*, has taken place on the land:

- A site inspection of the land by Department of Environment Regulation inspectors on 4 December 2014 confirmed that clearing had been carried out
- Aerial imagery between 2004 and 2014 shows native vegetation has been cleared on the land
- No clearing permit had been granted for the clearing.
- The clearing was not for an exempt purpose
- The clearing is unauthorised clearing under section 51C of the Environmental Protection Act 1986

# Requirements of this Notice:

The person to whom this vegetation conservation notice is given, and each subsequent owner and or occupier of the land who is bound by this vegetation conservation notice, are required to undertake the following specified measures:

## 1. No unlawful clearing

Ensure that no further unlawful clearing takes place on the land.

#### 2. Movement of soil prohibited

Ensure no movement of soil, including scraping, raking, ploughing or other mechanical movement of soil, is carried out within the *specified area* other than purposes required under this vegetation conservation notice or for the purpose of complying with a written firebreak notice issued under section 33 of the *Bushfires Act 1954*.

#### 3. Restoration of land levels

Restore land levels within the specified areas to the levels that existed at 1 November 2014 to prevent erosion or the drift or movement of sand, soil, dust or water

#### 4. Revegetation

- (a) Revegetate the specified area so as to achieve a species composition, structure, density and vegetation condition of native vegetation similar to pre clearing species composition, structure, density and vegetation condition.
- (b) Complete initial revegetation by 30 June 2017.
- (c) Ensure only local species are used in the revegetation
- (d) Where, for any reason, *revegetation* undertaken under measure 4(a) of this notice does not result in a species composition, structure, density and *vegetation condition* of native vegetation similar to pre clearing species composition, structure, density and *vegetation condition*, each and every year for a period of ten (10) years after the giving of this notice continue to *revegetate* the *specified area* until a species composition, structure, density and *vegetation condition* of native vegetation similar to pre clearing species composition, structure, density and *vegetation condition* is achieved.

## 5. Weed control

Each and every year for a period of ten (10) years after the giving of this notice

- (a) Remove or kill weed species within the specified area during the month of September of each year so that the percentage cover that is weed species is less than 20%;
- (b) Complete initial weed control by 30 September 2017

# 6 Monitoring

(a) Prior to 30 September 2017, establish five quadrats located so that the southwest corners are located at the coordinates set out in the table below; and

- (b) Permanently mark the southwest corner of each quadrat with a steel picket.
- (c) Engage an *environmental specialist* to carry out one vegetation survey in each of the quadrats in the month of September or October of each and every year for a period of ten (10) years after the giving of this notice to determine:
- (i) The species composition, structure, density and vegetation condition of native vegetation in each quadrat
- (ii) The percentage cover of native vegetation in each quadrat
- (ii) The percentage cover of vegetation in each quadrat that is weed species

# 7. Records must be kept

Maintain the following records for a period of ten (10) years from the date of the giving of this vegetation conservation notice

- (a) in relation to the revegetation of the specified area
  - (i) The date or dates of revegetation activities undertaken

- (ii) A description of the revegetation activities undertaken
- (iii) A list of species planted or seeded
- (iv) The number of each species planted or the quantity of seed for each species sown
- (b) in relation to weed control
  - (i) The date or dates on which weed species control activities were carried out
  - (ii) A description of the weed species control activities carried out on each date.
- (c) in relation to monitoring
  - (i) The species composition, structure, density and *vegetation condition* of native vegetation in the *specified* area as determined by the monitoring carried out under measure 6 of this notice.
  - (ii) The percentage cover of native vegetation in each quadrat
  - (iii) The percentage cover of vegetation in each quadrat that is weed species

## 8. Reporting

For a period of ten (10) years after the giving of this notice, provide to the *CEO*, on or before 30 June of each year, a written report of records kept under measure 7 of this notice for the period 1 January to 31 December of the preceding year.

#### **DEFINITIONS**

The following meanings are given to terms used in this Notice:

CEO means the Chief Executive Officer of the Department of the Public Service of the State through which the Environmental Protection Act 1986 is administered

environmental specialist means a person who holds a tertiary qualification in environmental science or equivalent, and has experience in the assessment of Western Australian native vegetation.

Keighery scale means the vegetation condition scale described in Bushland Plant Survey: A Guide to Plant Community Survey for the Community (1994) as developed by B.J. Keighery and published by the Wildflower Society of WA (Inc). Nedlands, Western Australia.

local species means native vegetation species recorded as naturally occurring within 20 kilometres of the land.

percentage cover means the area of ground covered by the canopy of each and every species of flora, including native flora, weed species and invasive weed species within the monitored area expressed as a percentage of the total cover of all species within the monitored area

revegetate, revegetated and revegetation means the re-establishment of native vegetation

*specified area* means those portions of Lot 709 on Deposited Plan 219608, Lot 710 on Deposited Plan 219608 and Lot 712 on Deposited Plan 219608 bounded by a line joining the Zone 50 GDA 94 points set out in the table below consecutively:

then directly to the point of commencement.

vegetation condition means the rating given to native vegetation using the Keighery scale and refers to the degree of change in the structure, density, and species present in the particular vegetation in comparison to undisturbed vegetation of the same type.

## weed species means any plant -

- (a) that is a declared pest under section 22 of the Biosecurity and Agriculture Management Act 2007; or
- (b) published in a Department of Parks and Wildlife Regional Weed Rankings Summary, regardless of ranking; or
- (c) that is not a species recorded as naturally occurring within 20 kilometres of the land
