The Permit Holder is authorised to clear native vegetation subject to the following conditions of this Permit.

1. Purpose for which clearing may be done

Clearing for the purpose of road widening.

2. Land on which clearing is to be done

Brookton-Kweda Road reserve, Brookton (PIN's 11698103, 11640737, 11698104, 11640738 and 11640760)

3. Area of Clearing

The Permit Holder must not clear more than 7 native trees within the area hatched yellow on attached Plan 7048/1.

4. Application

This Permit allows the Permit Holder to authorise persons, including employees, contractors and agents of the Permit Holder, to clear native vegetation for the purposes of this Permit subject to compliance with the conditions of this Permit and approval from the Permit Holder.

5. Type of clearing authorised

This Permit authorises the Permit Holder to clear native vegetation for the activities described in condition #1 of this Permit to the extent that the Permit Holder has the power to carry out works involving clearing for those activities under the *Local Government Act 1995* or any other written law.

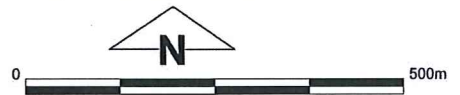

Decision on Permit Application: Granted
Decision Date: 23 June 2016
Reasons for Decision: The clearing application has been assessed against the clearing principles, planning instruments and other matters in accordance with s51O of the Environmental Protection Act 1986, and it has been concluded that the proposed clearing is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.

Through assessment it has been determined that the clearing is unlikely to have any significant environmental impacts. State policies and other relevant policies have been taken into consideration in the decision to grant a clearing permit.

2. Site Information

2.1. Existing environment and information

2.1.1. Description of the native vegetation under application

Vegetation Description	Beard vegetation association 1023 described as medium woodland; York gum, wandoo & salmon gum (Eucalyptus salmonophloia)	Vegetation Condition	Completely Degraded; No longer intact, completely/almost completely without native species (Keighery, 1994).
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3. Assessment of application against clearing principles, planning instruments and other relevant matters

Comments Consideration has been given to impacts to biodiversity, significant fauna habitat, rare flora, threatened ecological communities, remnant vegetation values, watercourses, land degradation, conservation areas, surface water quality, groundwater quality, and flooding. The assessment has found that the clearing under application is not likely to be at variance to any of the clearing principles.

The application was advertised for a seven day submission period on 23 May 2016 in The West Australian. No submissions relating to this application have been received.
