This mining lease is held by Boral. The approved clearing footprint, shown in Figure A, was historically cleared to establish the Gnangara Pine Plantation. These pines were cleared progressively from 2010 to

Vegetation condition was assessed by RPS in 2009 for this footprint and in 2014 for adjacent areas which overlapped this footprint and ranged from 'Very Good' to 'Completely Degraded'. The approved clearing footprint is located more than 100 metres from the nearest Conservation Category Wetland (UFI 8,408) and Bush Forever Site (No. 399) (Figure A).									
	Hanson are proposing to extend the duration of the existing clearing permit (CPS 7141/1) to allow the staged clearing of native vegetation to continue until 2031 (10 years). This will reduce the subsequent paperwork for future years and will extend to cover the remaining term of the screening licence (L6752/1995/11) (28 February 2030).									
	Clearing for the purpose of sand mining is directly proportional to the demand for the sand resource, which is primarily driven by population growth or significant infrastructure projects. Approximately 2.74 ha of the approved clearing footprint (23.55 ha) has been cleared thus far, as the demand for sand resources to date has not been sufficient to warrant continuous sand mining. However, this scenario can readily change.									
	Furthermore, the additional time frame allows Hanson to continue to utilise the native vegetation: as a buffer for noise, dust, and visual amenity to reducing the open area and significantly decreasing the potential weed load from outside sources to increase the long-term landform stability of the surrounding areas
