Midwest Sand Supplies are proposing to expand their sand extraction area within the Southgate Dunes. The approved Clearing Purpose Permit (CPS 7183/1 valid to 24 September 2021) area for clearing and the proposed expansion are both shown on the attached Sketch SK1665-01A. As shown in the Sketch, the expanded area is within the boundary of Lot 2453. The rationale for accessing and extracting sand from the expanded area to the south, is that this area appears to contain cleaner sand with less surface / buried vegetation. The surface / buried vegetation requires screening and removal (in accordance with the existing Clearing Permit), prior to stockpiling and distributing the lime sand end product. By accessing this apparently cleaner sand with less vegetation, Midwest Sand Supplies can reduce their screening and disposal requirements. This is likely to minimise the amount of vegetation clearing by Midwest Sand Supplies to achieve their annual sand extraction volumes. The purpose (sand extraction) and clearing conditions (buried vegetation and up to 0.4 ha of non-buried vegetation), outlined in the approved Clearing Purpose Permit (CPS 7183/1) attached, are not proposed for amendment. Midwest Sand Supplies propose to use the same methodology in the expanded area, as is currently being adopted, with a hydraulic excavator or front end loader to remove dead trees and shrubs that have been buried by the northward movement of the Southgate Dune system. Since the approved Clearing Purpose Permit (CPS 7183/1) is only valid until 24 September 2021, Midwest Sand Supplies are also seeking to extend the duration to include a further 5 year period (ie 24 September 2026).
