Permit Duration Extension

Anna Plains Cattle Co Pty Ltd (Anna Plains) request the permit expiry date is extended from 12 December 2022 to 12 December 2027.

The existing approved purpose permit is for clearing for the purpose of irrigated fodder production. The proposed vegetation clearing is 120 hectares within a 200-hectare footprint. To date no land clearing has occurred under this purpose permit.

Anna Plains plan to develop the irrigated fodder project in a staged manner, progressively land clearing for each stage. Each stage will be cleared, irrigated, and planted before moving the next stage. Irrigation will be sourced from groundwater bores.

Given this is the first time Anna Plains have attempted an irrigated fodder project and coordination of four separate external parties is required for each stage within each dry season, there is uncertainty around timeframes required to complete each stage.

Availability and coordination of outsourced separate labour and equipment required for pre land clearing fauna surveys (permit condition 8 (a) and (b)), land clearing, irrigation installation and then crop planting have been considered. Essentially these are four separate, external specialist labour and equipment arrangements for each component of land development in preparation for growing fodder. To coordinate external parties for four portions of work during the dry season will be challenging due to the location of Anna Plains and their distance to towns (250 km south of Broome and 370 km north of Port Hedland), regional capacity (i.e. availability of equipment and labour) and coordinating outsourced labour and equipment between their own client commitments and the pre clearing surveys, clearing, irrigation installation and planting.

Additionally, Anna Plains have been cautious of land clearing prior to the granting of requested groundwater allocation license amendments being granted, without groundwater, the irrigated fodder project is not viable. After some delays Anna Plains have recently recommenced engagement with the Department of Water Environment and Regulation (DWER) regarding the amendment of groundwater license GWL160619.

For these reasons an extension of the permit period by five years is requested to provide adequate time to finalise the increased groundwater allocation approvals and then fully develop each stage of the project.

Part 4: Proposed amendments

Removal of Condition 7

Anna Plains request Condition 7 is removed from the permit.

Condition 7 requires crops species are planted within three months of the authorised clearing being undertaken. To avoid non-compliance with the CPS7270/1 Anna Plains have avoided land clearing until groundwater license amendments are finalised.

To coordinate a staged approach for external parties to complete preclearing surveys, clearing, irrigation installation and planting within a three-month window will be challenging due to the location of Anna Plains and the distance to towns (250 km south of Broome and 370 km north of Port Hedland) and regional capacity (i.e. availability of equipment and labour).

The planned staged approach will require specialists and equipment to mobilise and demobilise at least four times during the project implementation phase.

No land clearing has occurred under the approved permit because Anna Plains have avoided unnecessarily clearing prior to DWER granting groundwater license amendment approvals. Anna Plains have recently recommenced engagement with the Department of Water Environment and Regulation (DWER) regarding the increased allocation amendment of groundwater license GWL160619.

Amendment to Condition 8(a) Fauna Management

It is proposed that Condition 8(a) is amended to remove the requirement to 'engage a fauna specialist' to undertake clearance surveys'...

Anna Plains propose Condition 8 (a) requires a 'suitably experienced person' undertakes clearance surveys prior to land clearing. It is proposed the 'suitably experienced person' does not require a valid fauna license or a tertiary qualification to complete a pre-clearance fauna search which will provide the opportunity for Traditional Owners and local Kimberley residents who have Bilby experience, to undertake preclearance surveys.

In the unlikely event that relocation of fauna is required, condition 8(b) will require a 'fauna specialist' as currently defined in the permit.

It should be noted that the Bamford Consulting Ecologist targeted Bilby survey completed in August 2017 'concluded that Bilbies are not currently present within the development envelope and no signs of recent activity could be found'. Bilbies are highly mobile, so it should not be assumed that because they weren't found during a targeted fauna search in 2017, they may not move in and out of the polygon.

To understand the current risk of Bilby presence in the polygon, a drone mission was flown approximately 35 m above ground level with transects spaced at 150 m within the approved clearing polygon on 28 and 29 October 2022. The drone missions were to confirm if the vegetation type was suitable to identify Bilby burrowing activity from above, and if so, use the drone mission to identify locations where possible Bilby burrowing activity was occurring within the polygon, where follow up investigation on foot could confirm any activity. Examples of photos from the drone mission are attached.

Upon examination of drone footage on a large monitor, no evidence of bilby burrowing activity was found, however it was noted in the field that future drone missions could be set to a lower flying altitude due to the vegetation present consisting 'of tall and medium height shrubs 1-3 metres high over a ground layer dominated by grasses and soft perennial sub-shrubs' (Enviroworks, 2017).

IF evidence of Bilby activity was found, the locations would have been recorded so in future, the area could be ground truthed on foot and monitored to understand Bilby activity in preparation for land clearing, and the assess the potential for relocating individuals.
