1. Realignment will be 3.0 km long and 20 m long - 6.00 ha. 2. The gravel pit will be 1.44 ha.

Proposed method of clearing

Dozing and track rolling vegetation and overburden for the realignment. Dozing and stockpiling of vegetation and overburden for rehabilitation for the gravel pit.

Period within which clearing is proposed to be undertaken, e.g. May 2010 - June 2010

Purpose of clearing

To realign the Beringarra Pindar Road at a point commencing at GPS Coordinates (northern end of road realignment) southing 26.58.42.03 easting 116.31.16.10, heading south for 3.0 km - the road is winding and presents safety issues.

This road is a vital link to the soon to be constructed International Square Kilometre Array project.

The proposed gravel pit is a new pit that we need to open to provide gravel for the realignment.

Part 3 Applicant

To apply for a permit you must either be:

- the landowner; or
- have the authority of the landowner to access the land and undertake the clearing.

If granted, the permit will be issued in the name of the applicant.
