Approximately 0.7Ha (6,960m²) = total area of pads/drill sites; however, only a very small portion of this may be cleared, depending on contractor (driller) requirements on site. Typical clearance would be limited to a 1m² of topsoil removal per pad for the digging of an inspection pit for drilling.

Proposed method of clearing or final land use

Mechanical Back hoe or manual digging with reinstatement after drilling works.

Period within which clearing is proposed to be undertaken, e.g. May 2013 – June 2018

Approximately March 2017 – August 2017

Clearing will be undertaken for the installation of groundwater monitoring bores to investigate groundwater quality and availability, as part of the broader Groundwater investigation for the Myalup Water for Food Project
