

CPS7635/2 CLEARING PERMIT COMPLIANCE 2017-2021

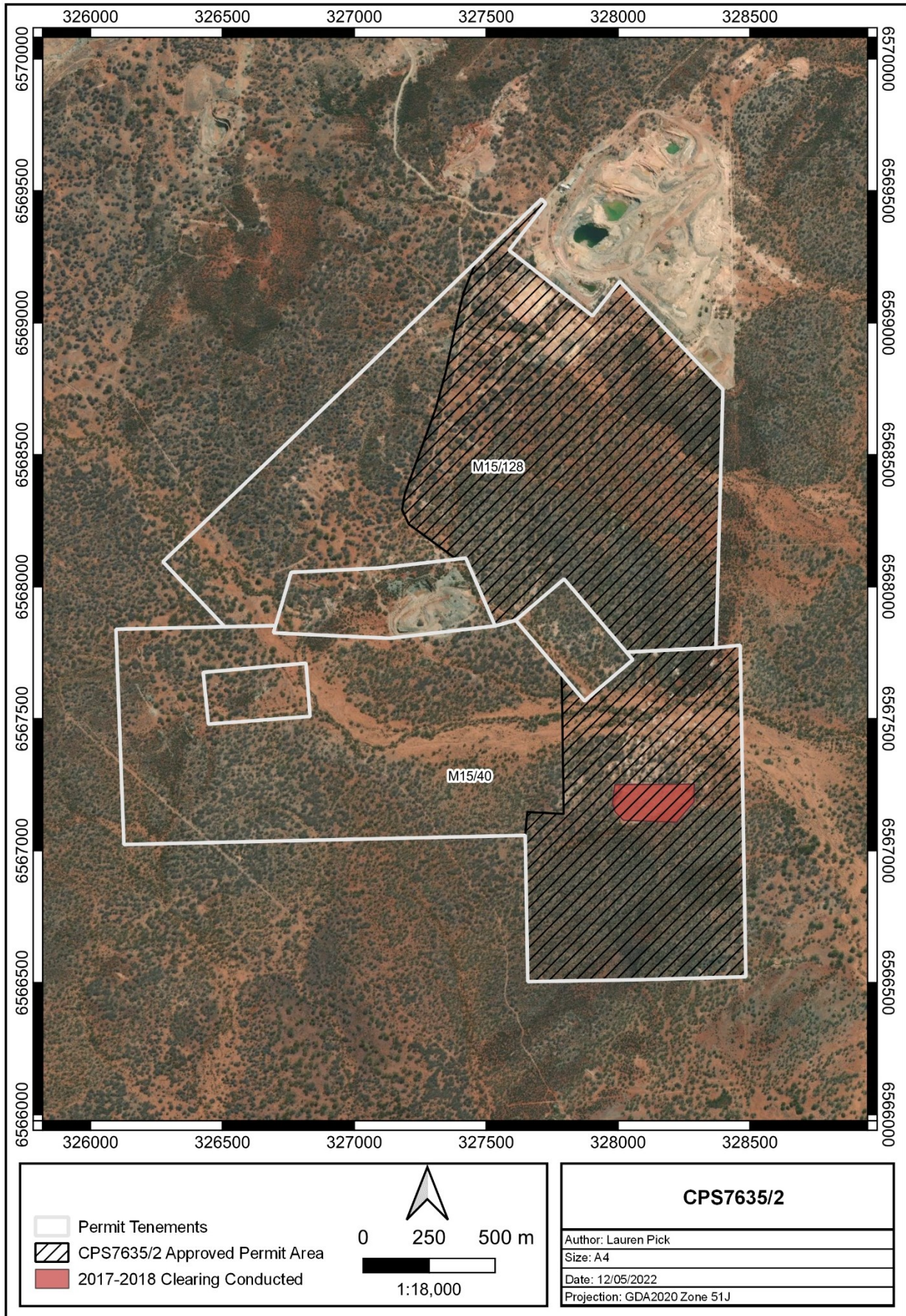
Under the current clearing permit for the Coolgardie Gold Project (CPS7635/2) a total of 107.07 of clearing is authorised of which 3.96 ha of clearing has been conducted under the permit. Clearing activities were conducted in compliance with all conditions of the clearing permit.

ANNUAL REPORT COVERING ACTIVITIES FOR NATIVE VEGETATION CLEARING PERMIT (CPS 7635/2) FOR THE REPORTING PERIOD 1 JULY 2017 TO 30 JUNE 2018.

As required under Condition 8 of the Native Vegetation Clearing Permit CPS 7635/2 issued on the 1 March 2018, please find below reporting for the native vegetation cleared from 30 June 2017 to 1 July 2018. Reporting has been completed by Primary Gold Limited (Primary) which wholly owns the MacPhersons Reward Pty Ltd subsidiary. Table 1 provides a summary of the native vegetation clearing across Mining Lease 15/40 and 15/128, while Table 2 presents compliance against conditions of the permit. In total 3.96 hectares (of the 107.07 hectares approved) were cleared during the reporting period with 103.11 hectares remaining to be cleared. Clearing occurred within the proposed Tycho pit area in roughly a rectangular shape that was centred on grid coordinates 328125 mE and 6567175 mN, Zone 51, Datum Australia 1994 (GDA94).

(b) Prior to 2 September 2022, the Permit Holder must provide to the Director Operations, Resource and Environmental Compliance, Department of Mines, Industry Regulation and Safety a written report of records required under Condition 7 of this Permit where these records have not already been provided under Condition 8(a) of this Permit.
