Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

Pruning to be completed using professional arborists then stump grinding / removal to eliminate roadside hazards within the drain lines.

Purpose of clearing

The current road geometry is too narrow with blind crests creating a hazard for passing vehicles and roadside trees which have narrowed the road width over time due to lack of maintenance.

The purpose of the work is to construct/ reinstate the road corridor, inclusive of constructing improved roadside drains which are currently non-existent causing localised flooding. The works will improve the sight distance & reduce potential risk's.
