

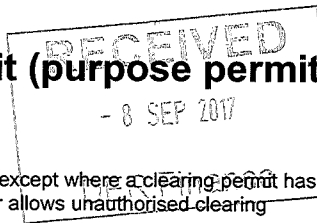


Application for a clearing permit (purpose permit)

Environmental Protection Act 1986 s 51E

FORM C2

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.

Part 1 Assessment under the EPBC bilateral agreement

The native vegetation clearing processes under Part V of the *Environmental Protection Act 1986* (EP Act) have been accredited by the Commonwealth of Australia under the *Environment Protection and Biodiversity Conservation Act 1999* (EPBC Act) and can be assessed under an assessment bilateral agreement.

Excavator to clear an access track where necessary to facilitate boreholes and trial pits.

Period within which clearing is proposed to be undertaken, e.g. May 2018– June 2023

It is proposed that the clearing will be undertaken in November 2019.

Purpose of clearing

The purpose of the clearing permit is to gain access to undertaken hydrogeological and geotechnical investigations to determine the suitability for the development of a landfill facility. The site investigations will include an access track as well as boreholes and trial pits. This should be noted that there are large areas within the proposed clearing areas that there is no vegetation. In addition, access tracks and trial pits will be slightly tweaked while on site to avoid vegetation as best as possible. Therefore, it is anticipated that the total area that will actually be cleared will not much less than the 7.16 hectares listed above.

The Shire undertook a detailed Site Selection Study to determine a Preferred Location of the development of the Pilbara Regional Waste Management Facility (PRWMF). Arising from these works, Site 10, located within Lot 150, Onslow Road was determined as the preferred site.</p> <p>The Shire has engaged with the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions about the proposal to develop a landfill to best practice standards at the site. A letter of in-principle support for further consideration of the site for the development of the landfill from the Department of Biodiversity, Conservation and Attractions was obtained from the then Director General Mr. Jim Sharp (attached).</p> <p>The Shire previously was granted access to the Site from the Department of Planning, Land and Heritage however this approval has now lapsed. The Shire has recently submitted an application to renew the access approval for the site.</p>
