

**Application for a clearing permit (purpose permit)***Environmental Protection Act 1986 s 51E***FORM C2**

Clearing of native vegetation is prohibited in Western Australia except where a clearing permit has been granted or an exemption applies. A person who causes or allows unauthorised clearing commits an offence.
