	The area in relation to condition 7(a) has been surveyed by an Ecological contractor (Terratree), and priority flora species have been identified, as outlined in the attached survey report.					
	The design of the required intersections to the Yandin wind farm at Yandin road has been updated to provide as much clearance (buffer zone) as possible to the identified priority flora species, however it is not possible to construct whilst maintaining a 30m buffer zone. The finalised design has been provided as an attachment to this amendment application.					
	Accordingly, this amendment has been applied for to reduce the construction buffer zone to priority flora to 10m.

	 All Priority Flora identified during the targeted surveys shall be clearly demarcated on site with fluorescent ribbon, and a 10m buffer zone shall be pegged and flagged; Prior to commencing clearing works a site walkdown shall be conducted with all personnel to review the buffer zone and to review the location of identified Flora A risk assessment shall be conducted to identify all risks and ensure appropriate measures are in place prior to commencing works; All clearing works shall be conducted with a spotter to ensure the buffer zone is not encroached upon; The delineated buffer zone shall remain in place for the duration of all road construction works.
