The removal of these 2 trees is to allow the Shire to widen the Boyup Brook-Arthur Road From a 6.0 metre wide road with narrow shoulders to a 7.0 metre wide road with 1.5 metre shoulders and to correct road geometry. This will improve the road safety for road users including 4 daily school buses and road trains. These 2 trees are all that is required to be cleared to enable the next 4kilometres of road in an easterly direction to be widened.
