	Main Roads calculates that the minimum acceptable offset for acquisition would be 13.1 for impact on Carnabys Cockatoo and Banksia woodland TEC. Main Roads is seeking a monetary offset at a rate of \$10,100 per ha for a total of \$132,528.70. In addition Main Roads is proposing a land acquisition offset for impacts on vegetation growing in association with a wetland of 8.4 ha.
