If yes, provide details: The Shire of Donnybrook-Balingup has identified the need for a strategic source of gravel close to our Donnybrook town site to service our needs going into the future.						
	The Shire currently has a gravel resource located adjacent to our Donnybrook Waste Management Facility, and they are both on DBCA land (refer included map). This pit has provided 20,000 m3 of gravel over the past 3 years and has now been exhausted.						
	The Shire has explored private options over the past few years within a 10km radius of the Donnybrook Town Site, however unfortunately we have either not been able to negotiate an agreement with owners, or test holes have not achieved desired results to progress further.						
	It is considered that the Shires ability to secure a resource from the private sector is hindered by the location of large private gravel supply company pits within the area, which appears to inflate the desired price that many property owners are seeking for gravel resources located on their land. These companies mainly stock MRWA spec gravel, and maintain a significant portion of their supply for MRWA use.						
	The Shire has identified the degraded bushland off Gavin's Road (refer map) as a site of high potential to facilitate our requirements for a long term strategic gravel supply located with close proximity of Donnybrook.
