	<p>Purpose of clearing:</p> <p>The City is seeking approval from the Department of Water and Environmental Regulation (DWER) to undertake vegetation removal along the foreshore path from Goodwood Parade to Tanunda Drive, Rivervale over a four year period. (Lot details can be found in attachment 1).</p> <p>The purpose of the clearing is to provide sufficient height clearance for access by emergency services vehicles, and to prevent risk to pedestrians and cyclists using the foreshore path.</p> <p>Over time vegetation encroaches the foreshore path, either through natural growth or instability. The frequency that this occurs is at least one incident of encroachment per year, with each occurrence involving native vegetation requiring a separate application to clear.</p> <p>To avoid the requirement for duplication and to streamline this process, the City is applying for a permit to clear for a four year period.</p>
