#### Part 1: Assessment bilateral agreement

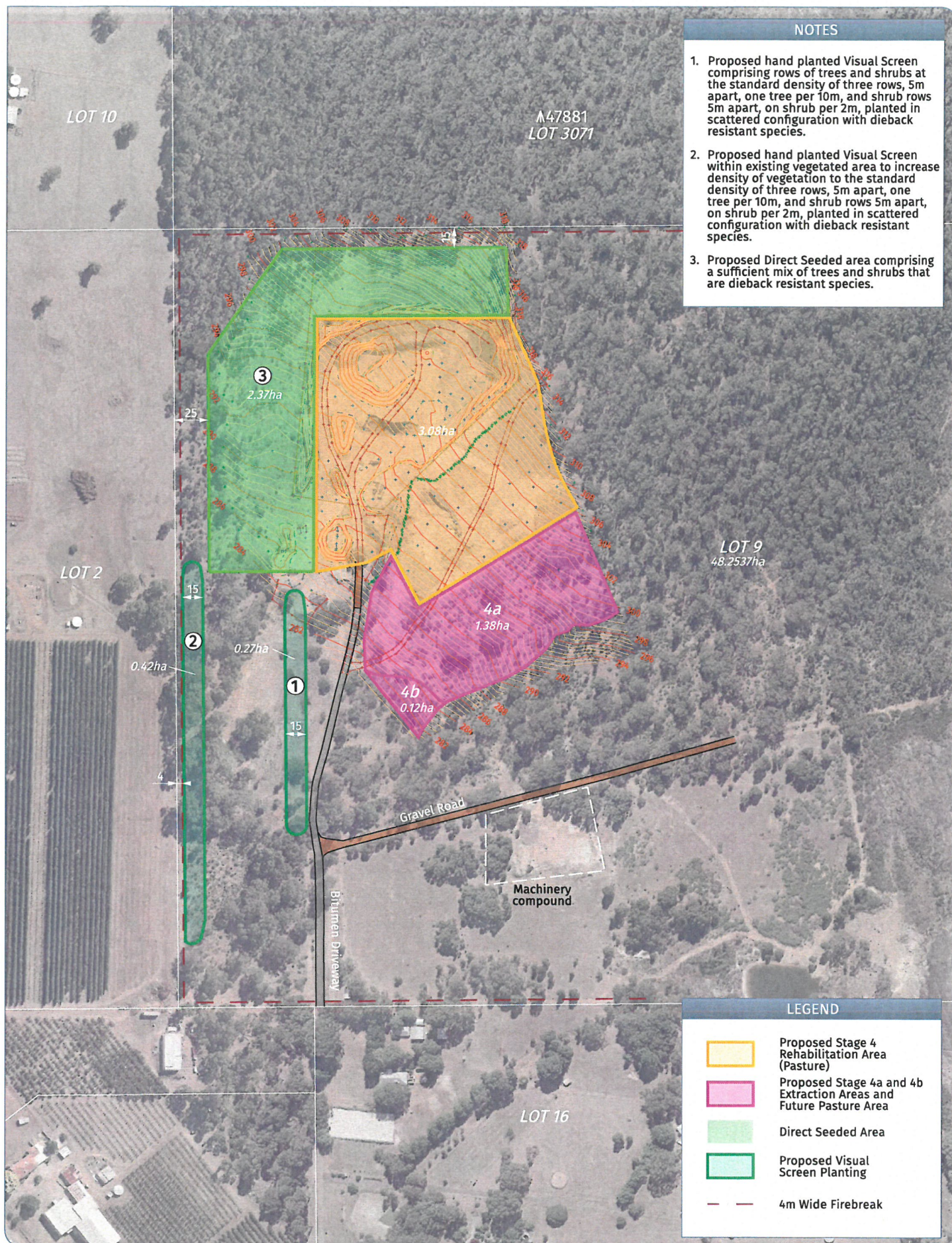

3. Proposed Direct Seeded area comprising a sufficient mix of trees and shrubs that are dieback resistant species.
